Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words.

The college has permanent affiliation for four under-graduate programs: two other self- financed UG programs and one PG program. Two research laboratories, Botany and Chemistry are recognized research centers. Also, the college has very active NSS, NCC and Lifelong Learning units.

The college follows standard procedures such as implementing the Academic diary, Teaching plan, Academic Calendar etc for all faculties.

College website also displays all the curricular, co-curricular and other necessary information. Departmental meetings ,meeting with principal regarding work load distribution, teaching methodologies, planning and execution of assignments, seminars, projects, tests (MCQs, problem solving, quiz etc.), demos and conduction of practical, study tours, field visits, industrial tours, surveys, guest lecturers etc are discussed during the meetings. Syllabus completion report is submitted by the faculty regularly. Test tutorials, question paper workshop, class test, projects, counseling, career guidance etc are conducted throughout the year and bridge course for first year students is conducted by respective faculty at the beginning of academic year.

Monthly attendance report is submitted by every faculty and attendance status of the students is communicated to the parents by way to SMS. College also practices Tutor- Ward mechanism by allotting a fixed ratio of teacher to students and monitoring the progress of student. For effective delivery of the curriculum, college follows the chalk-board method, power point presentation and multimedia classes, departmental and central library with highly developed infrastructure like OPAC, INFLIBNET, N-list, book-bank scheme, Central Library of Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University (KRC Remote Access of E- Database) , syllabus, question papers, faculty publications etc.

How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution?

The college has its mechanism to obtain feedback on curriculum from academic experts, outgoing students and alumni.

Students Feedback is obtained from students at the end of the academic year in standard format.

The feedback proforma permits the liberty to student in filling the teacher-wise, subject-wise rating and performance of respective teachers in all aspects like presentation, communicative skills of teachers, interaction and assessment ability also discipline in class. 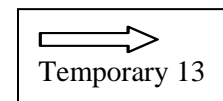
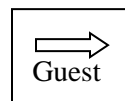
